The H2Orchestra is an interactive musical event for up to 50 people aged 2 and up. Its communicative process of water music composition brings together people of all ages, encouraging multigenerational dialogue. The H2Orchestra is made up of more than 50 instruments in 25 tubs plus mechanical gadgets that make water sounds or that need water in order to produce sound. Some of the instruments are housed in metal sculptures created by art machine builder Stefan Schilling. As players explore them side by side and across from each other, the collection of instruments encourages collective sound experimentation and musical interaction.

With its Splish-and-Splash Piano, Kerplunk Poles, Dunk Gong, Bottle Gong, Water Organ, Flubbery Funnelcone, huge Swimdrums, Bubbletub, Lotus Pipes and Drench Chimes, the H2Orchestra can be positioned in a circle 15 meters in diameter and set up in a field, on the street or on cobblestone pavement.

Conceptualization & Realization: Michael Bradke Created in 1993 for the "Water-Water" exhibition at the Kaleidoskop children's museum in Frankfurt-am-Main. Test run: August 1993 within the framework of the Oikos-Sinnereich Project in the Schyren open-air pool and Starnberger See in Munich and in the Frauensee in Tyrol, Austria. Exhibited in 1993 for the "Hands On" international children's museum conference in Berlin. Since then, thanks to cooperative collaboration between artist and users, children and adults, it has seen increased development with every successive year and has been guest at hundreds of family events, museum festivals and vacation projects and at the international Musikmesse in Frankfurt and the Autostadt in Wolfsburg for six weeks in both 2009 and 2010. © Photos: Michael Bradke


